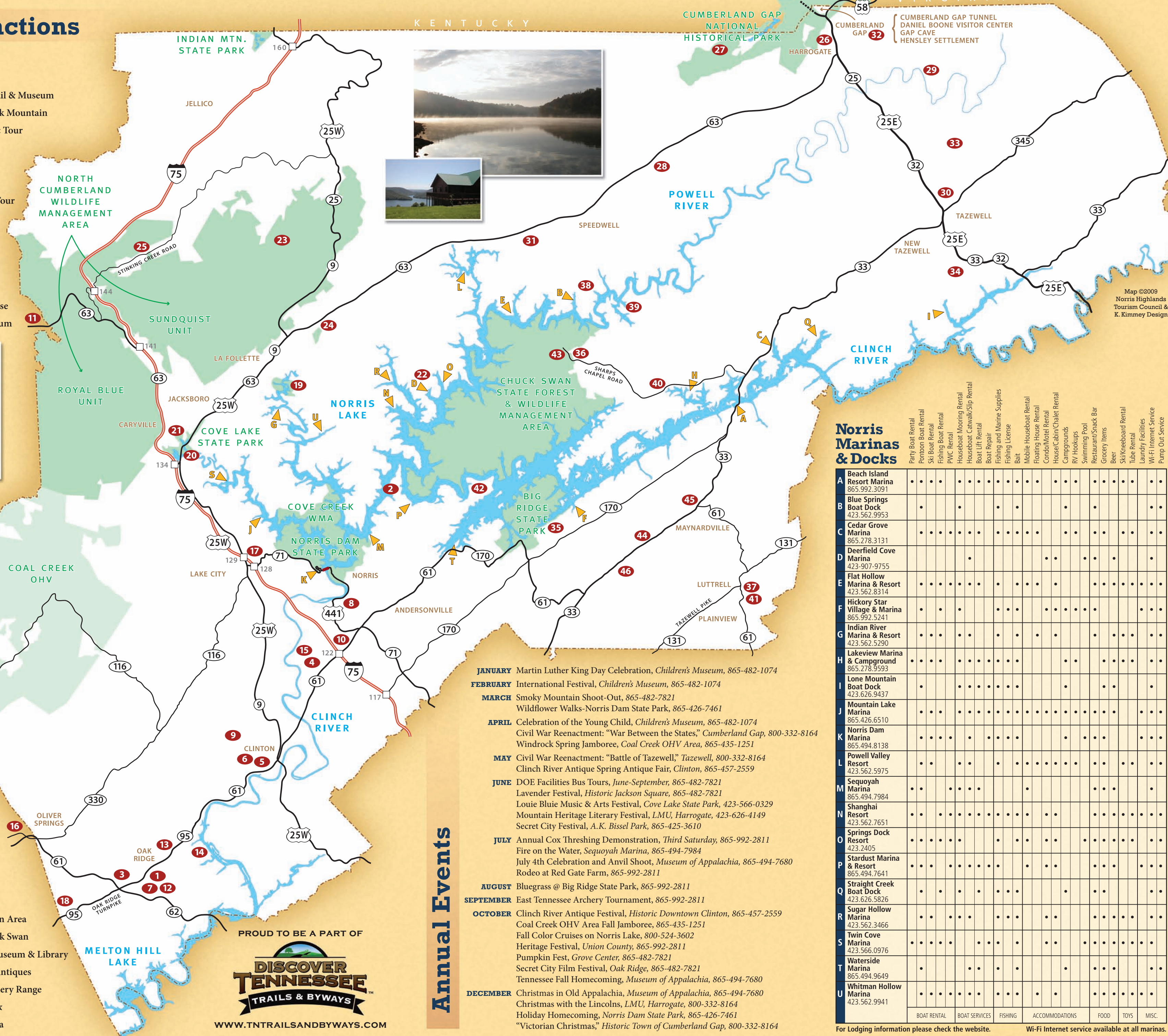

An emerald lake, wide open spaces, a rich heritage of culture, music and history await you in this East Tennessee vacation playground. With over 800 miles of shoreline, Norris Lake is perfect for boating, kayaking, canoeing, camping, and fishing. The Chuck Swan WMA located at the confluence on the Clinch and Powell Rivers and the 72,000 acre Coal Creek OVH provide activities for hunters, bikers, ATV enthusiasts and wildlife watchers. For history buffs, the Museum of Appalachia and the Cumberland Gap National Historic Park relate the stories of the early settlers of the area. More recent history is alive in the once-secret city of Oak Ridge where the atomic bomb was built as part of the Manhattan Project. *Come explore all the Highlands have to offer.*



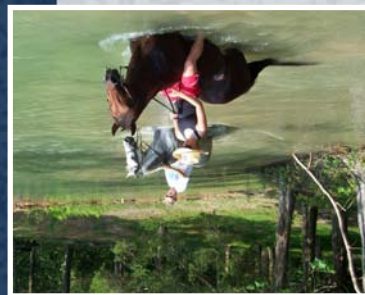
Bird watching enthusiasts are likely to see multiple species including blue heron, water fowl, game birds such as quail and doves, and nesting eagles. The area includes archery and shooting ranges at several of the Wildlife management areas, as well as 3D archery and tournaments at the Union County Archery Range.

The Royal Blue WMA, Chuck Swan WMA, and Coal Creek OHB are a favorite destination for ATV Riders. Big Ridge State Park and Savage Gardens are naturalist parks abundant in wildlife and rare seasonal wild flowers such as jack in the pulpit. Each season is a tapestry of color. Spring brings purples of flowering dogwood, red bud and violets. During the summer, the canopy of green provides shade, as well as fern guarded streams and blackberry picking. Fall is majestic when the oaks, maples, poplars and hickory turn the area oranges, red and yellow with color. Winter is striking with early morning fog off the lake and the serenity of paddling through the stillness of the water. Camping and back packing are available at many of the parks and recreation areas that are waiting to be explored.



With six state parks, one national park, five wildlife conservation areas, multiple parks and recreation areas, there are plenty of places to explore by bike, hike or motorized vehicles for all levels of explorers. Each park has a trail system and maps available to help you explore the variety of terrain that is available. Cumberland Gap National Historical Park offers the original Hensley pioneer settlement which may be accessed by bus. Other attractions in the park include the historic town of Cumberland Gap, the majestic underground cathedral

Norris Highlands is rich in the traditions of Appalachian culture. The Museum of Appalachia is a living history museum of pioneers, mountain and early artifacts of Southern Appalachia. The museum was recently named as an affiliate of the great Smithsonian Institution for its natural beauty and history. The Abraham Lincoln Library and Museum, the grist mills at Lenoir Museum and Big Ridge State Park, and the Historic Jackson Square presents visitors a glimpse of the life in early East Tennessee. Crafts and music also beckon. With the advent of warm and sunny weather, the "porch musicians" can be found at various venues offering daily live and informal performances of authentic old-time music—along with a friendly welcome, a few "tall tales," and tidbits of fascinating information about artifacts, and events. Don't miss the opportunity to shop the unique arts and crafts centers, such as Historic Downtown Clinton, featuring true Appalachian art including hand made quilts, glass, pottery, instruments and hand tied "flies."
